COVID-19 VACCINES ARE NOW AVAILABLE TO 12-21 YEAR OLDS!

Q: WHO MAKES THE DECISION WHETHER I CAN GET THE VACCINE?

A: If you are 18 years of age or older, you do!

If you are 12-17, your foster or relative caregiver or STRTP staff can provide consent as long as you agree.

Q: WHAT IF I WANT THE VACCINE BUT MY CAREGIVER OR PARENT DOES NOT AGREE?

A: If your caregiver or parent will not consent to you getting the vaccine contact your CLC attorney.

Q: HOW MUCH DOES THE VACCINE COST?

A: The Covid vaccine is free for everyone.

Q: WHICH VACCINE SHOULD I GET?

A: All three vaccines (Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson) are safe and effective. However, only Pfizer is approved for 12-17 year olds. So be sure to sign up at a Pfizer site if you are under 18.

Q: WHAT DO I NEED TO BRING WITH ME WHEN I GET VACCINATED?

A: Proof that you live or work in Sacramento County and photo ID. If you do not have a photo ID contact your CLC attorney.
